

Research







Research

As a researcher, you can't rely on one data set to inform your thinking, so you need to look at a number of sources. If misinformation were to surface during the monitoring phase of the research, I would be looking at a number of verifiable sources to counteract this information.

Some of the Sources may include:

1. Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS)
2. Australian Department of Home Affairs
3. Australian Housing and Urban Research Institute (AHURI)
4. Universities and Academic Journals
5. Think Tanks and Research Institutes (Lowy Institute, Grattan Institute, Migration Council)
6. Government Reports and Publications
7. Core Logic


Love
